Ladies and Gentlemen:

I have lived in Carmel since the mid 1980's, and I have served the City in various capacities, including the Carmel City Council, and as a deputy City Attorney. I am also currently on several Boards which work to make Carmel a better place, including the Chamber of Commerce, Carmel Rotary, and Pac Rep.

With regard to PAC REP, it has been my observation that traffic on Monte Verde has gradually increased over the years, and that the speed of cars operating on Monte Verde Street, especially in the vicinity of the Golden Bough Theater, has increased to the point that the lives of children and seniors could be endangered.

I am aware that a neighbor of the Golden Bough, Carl Iverson, has a warning sign which warns motorists to exercise "caution" on account of "Children at Play." Carl has offered to donate that sign to the City, and he believes—as to I—that his sign would be a first step to remind motorists of the need to exercise restraint as they drive in the vicinity of the Golden Bough.

Thank you for your consideration of such a sign on Monte Verde Street.
