- B.** Carpenter Street 2 N/W of First Avenue; review a request for a fence to be installed along the west side of Carpenter Street for pedestrian safety

- A.** Review traffic and parking issues along Dolores Street, between Vista and First Avenues, particularly during drop off and pick up of students at Stevenson School
- B.** Consider making the south curb a "no parking" zone for the full block on Fourth Avenue, between San Carlos and Dolores Streets
- C.** Consider reinstalling a railing that was removed several years ago at N/E Dolores Street & Third Avenue
- D.** Consider installing a speed limit sign on northbound Rio Road, between Lasuen Drive and Santa Lucia Avenue
- E.** Review Assembly Bill No. 1909: Bicycle Omnibus Bill: e-bikes allowed on bikeways unless ordinance prohibits
